## First-ever Guidance on Safe Cooking Fuel for Refugees Is Focus of Launch on April 30

The issue of safe fuel in refugee settings has not been systemically addressed—until now.

Refugee and displaced women and girls are at risk of rape, beatings and murder when they leave camps to search for wood to cook for their families, or to sell. When burned inside the home, firewood releases toxic fumes that threaten the health of the entire family. The mass cutting of trees leads to severe deforestation in already unstable environments.

The first-ever global guidance documents focus on the need to ensure safe access to appropriate cooking fuel in humanitarian settings from the start of every emergency. As part of the global initiative, 20,000 user-friendly posters and 10,000 flashdrives pre-loaded with background documents will be distributed to field offices of all major UN agencies and nongovernmental organizations worldwide. Workshops for practitioners will be conducted in sites such as Kenya, Sudan, Thailand and Congo.
