

ASRH Case Study  
Exit Interview with **Adolescents**

**INTRODUCTION:**

Hello, my name is \_\_\_\_\_ and I am here on behalf the Women's Refugee Commission and Save the Children to look at health programs for adolescent girls and boys in humanitarian settings.

- The Women's Refugee Commission is an advocacy organization based in New York, USA. The organization advocates for changes in laws, policies and programs to improve the lives and protect the rights of refugee and displaced women, children and young people.
- Save the Children is an international humanitarian organization that helps people in conflict and crisis. Save the Children works with other international NGOs as well as local youth organizations in almost 25 countries to advocate for and implement programs in health, protection, education and jobs for adolescents.

**PURPOSE:** The purpose of this interview is to learn about your experience with \_\_\_\_\_ program's services for girls and boys 10-19.

**SELECTION:** You have been selected as we are conducting interviews of girls and boys your age who have come to this program for sexual and reproductive health services.

**VOLUNTARY PARTICIPATION:** Your participation in this interview is voluntary. You may decide to participate or not. If you do not participate, you will not lose any health care services that you normally receive. You may stop the interview at any time if you feel uncomfortable.

**PROCEDURES:** We will ask you a series of questions on your experiences with \_\_\_\_\_'s program. The interview will last about 15 minutes. If you do not wish to answer specific questions, you do not need to do so.

There is no wrong or right answer to the questions, so please do not worry if you are not sure about the answers.

**USE OF INFORMATION AND CONFIDENTIALITY:** The information you share will help other organizations in different countries provide better health services to girls and boys your age.

Some of the questions may be personal and some people may find it difficult to answer. Your answers will be kept private and secret. No one will know that the answers came from you. We will never use your name with anything you tell us.

**RISKS AND BENEFITS:** There are no identifiable risks to participating in the interview. We do not think that these questions will be upsetting to you, but if the questions are upsetting or difficult for you to answer, we can stop the interview at any time or we can skip those questions. There is no payment or other material benefit to be gained from participating in this interview.

**I would like to answer any questions you might have about this exercise and/or your participation. Do you have any questions?**

**CONSENT:** You can tell me verbally if you would like to participate or not. If you agree, I will make a note of this. (After answering any questions, use the “Authorization and Release Form” from the Women’s Refugee Commission; the interviewer signs that verbal consent has been obtained.)

**FURTHER INFORMATION AND SHARING OF RESULTS:** In a few months time, we will develop a short report in both English and the local language that summarizes our findings from the many interviews we will conduct with girls and boys your age, and program staff in different countries. We will give the report to \_\_\_\_\_ staff so that you will receive it around November 2012.
