

- A study of Burmese migrant workers on the Thai/Burma border revealed that very few Burmese women had ever seen a condom.
- Pregnancy complications and other reproductive health problems were the leading causes of death among Afghan refugees surveyed in camps in Pakistan.

The majority of the 50 million refugees and displaced people worldwide still have no access to basic reproductive health care: family planning

have no access to basic reproductive health care: family planning, treatment for sexually transmitted diseases (STDs), emergency contraceptives, care for life-threatening problems during pregnancy, and medical or counselling services after rape.



"Conference 2000: Findings on Reproductive Health Care of Refugees and Displaced Populations" will bring together some of the world's foremost reproductive health care experts to present new research on STDs (including HIV/AIDS), family planning, safe motherhood and sexual violence in refugee settings.

Delegates from 27 countries including Sierra Leone, Pakistan, Thailand, Colombia and Sudan will attend presentations on such topics as:



- adolescent sexual health in Tanzanian refugee camps
- revitalizing health services after the war in Kosovo
- improving family planning services for displaced people in Sri Lanka.
- reproductive health needs of Afghan refugees in Pakistan



The findings reveal an increase in reproductive health services for refugees over the last five years, while still emphasizing the acute need for basic reproductive health care for populations in crisis throughout the world.

The research will help relief organizations and refugee agencies to tackle HIV/AIDS, unsafe abortion, pregnancy complications and other health emergencies faced by refugee populations.
