WRC Individual commitments

1. Commitment for the Action Coalition "Gender-Based Violence (GBV)"

Action theme: Scaling up evidence driven prevention programming

Title: Action research on GBV Prevention

Location: East Africa Duration: 2 years

Commitment: WRC will support and collaborate with two civil society organizations focusing on gender-based violence and gender equality to conduct an action research analysis of the enablers and barriers to their interventions on GBV and engagement with humanitarian actors. The research will focus on an East African country. The timeframe for completion is March 2022. WRC will ensure benchmarks internally and commits to chose CSOs and research partners by end March 2021, Research design and implementation plan finalized by end June 2021 and have action research and report completed by end December 2022. We will measure progress for annual reporting through regular updates produced in collaboration with CSO partners on status of analysis.

2. Commitment for the Action Coalition "Bodily autonomy and sexual and reproductive health and rights (SRHR)"

Action theme: Increase availability of contraception (and other services)

Title: Access to and use of SRHR for displaced populations

Location: Global Duration: 3 years

Commitment: Strengthen commitment and catalyze action among donors, governments, and partners across the humanitarian and development nexus to ensure that all people affected by crises can access and use high-quality sexual and reproductive health services. Advocate for stakeholders to prioritize contraception as part of the package of essential health services in crisis-affected settings and build the evidence base and advocate for improved supply chain practices. Advocate to donors, development and humanitarian organizations to collaborate to build community and national resilience for sexual and reproductive health in preparedness and recovery initiatives with a focus on often marginalized and underserved populations. Advocate and fundraise to continue to support and strengthen local women-led SRH programming. Advocate for and support community-based provision of SRH to displaced and host populations; fundraise to pilot and document the safety, feasibility and efficacy of community-based clinical care for GBV survivors, with the goal of advancing global guidance in line with research findings and collaborate with implementing agencies to advance efforts to assess community capacity and build community resilience for comprehensive SRH.

3. Commitment for Action Coalition "Economic Justice and Rights"

Action theme: Increase women's access to and control over productive resources
Title: Ensuring Integration of Cash and Voucher Assistance in GBV response

Location: Ecuador, NW Syria and Colombia

Duration: 2 years

Commitment: WRC will train, provide technical assistance to, and support operational partners to implement the integration of Cash and Voucher Assistance into specialized gender-based violence

response services in at least 3 humanitarian settings by December 2022. All partners in 3 countries will be trained and provided with technical assistance by December 2021. WRC will measure progress for annual reporting through regular updates produced in collaboration with partners.

 Timeframe for completion and benchmarks over the life of the 2021-2025
- Under Economic Justice: External Commitment: Through a series of multistakeholder convenings, the Global Campaign for Equal Nationality Rights will heighten awareness amongst policy makers and civil society in three regions of the economic harm caused by gender discrimination in nationality laws, including barriers to women's economic empowerment, and of the role of gender-equal nationality laws in advancing economic justice. The Global Campaign for Equal Nationality Rights will work with coalition members to document the economic harm caused by gender discrimination in nationality laws through the collection of affected persons' testimonies in five countries. Timeframe for completion and benchmarks over the life of the 2021-2025
- Under Gender-based Violence: Through a series of multistakeholder convenings, the Global Campaign for Equal Nationality Rights will heighten awareness amongst policy makers and civil society in three regions of the links between gender discrimination in nationality laws and gender-based violence, including child marriage, human trafficking, domestic violence, and the role of discriminatory nationality laws in contributing to the root cause of GBV, women's unequal status in society. The Global Campaign for Equal Nationality Rights will work with coalition members to document the links between gender-based violence and gender discrimination in nationality laws through the collection of affected persons' testimonies in five countries. Timeframe for completion and benchmarks over the life of the 2021-2025

5. Global Partner Network for Feminist Foreign Policy led by the International Center for Research on Women (ICRW)

• Under Feminist Leadership and Movements: The Global Partner Network for Feminist Foreign Policy is an informal, global and multi-stakeholder network and dedicated space for the advancement of the field of feminist foreign policy. Its main purpose is to deepen understanding about the ideas, policies, collaboration opportunities and partners working to advance feminist foreign policy in a range of global contexts, and to identify concrete actions and timelines to move this agenda forward—including at the Generation Equality

Forum. By joining the Global Partner Network, partners will encourage learning and adoption of the shared framework for a feminist foreign policy, and serve as resources to be called upon for action and advice.
